Students now have access to records

CHICAGO—Schools must publicize the fact that parents and students now have the right to see their files and comply with requests within 45 days.

Students can be certain of what is on their records before they are sent to university administrations. Having access to their records, students can exercise control over statement such as: "This child caused nothing but trouble throughout his school years". Beware of this student: This student went to jail; He is emotionally and mentally uncouth. "He should attend a vocational school rather than a regular one."

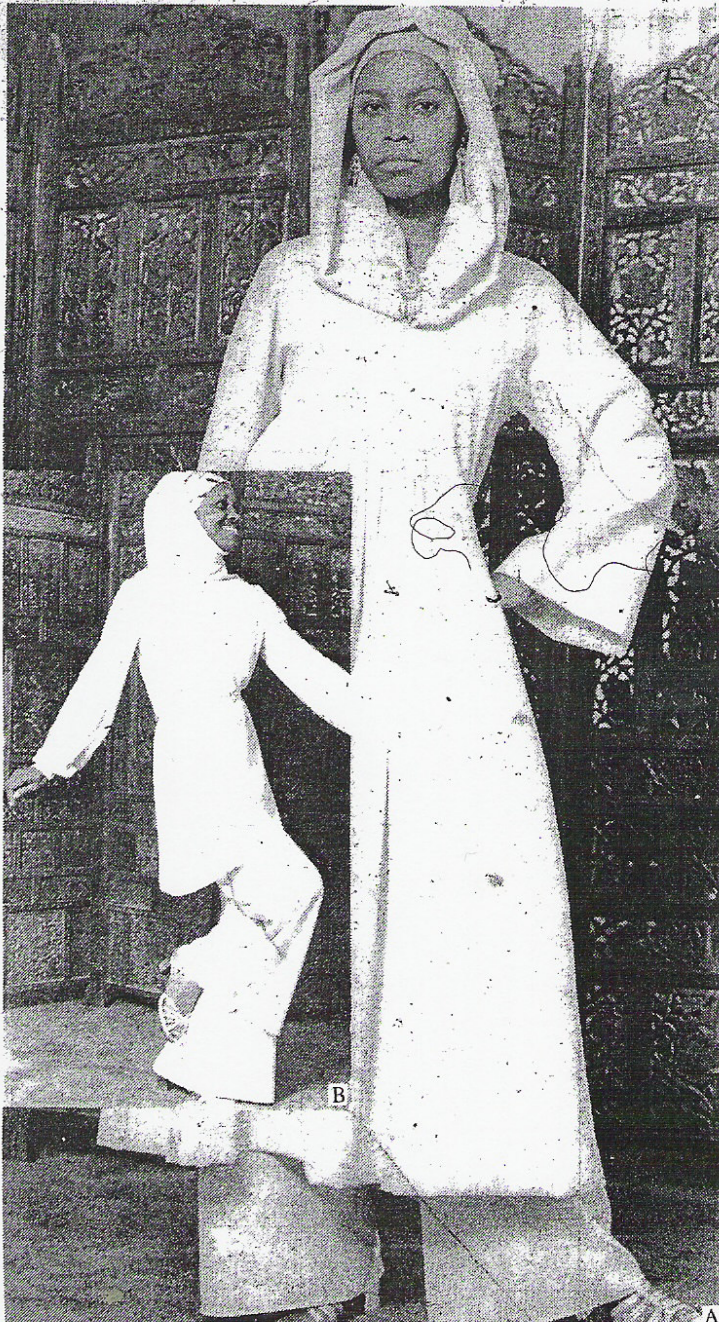
THE BUCKLEY AMENDMENT, named after its principal sponsor, Sen. James L. Buckley, (R-N.Y.) (Cons.) provides students and parents with greater access to and control over information contained in educational records.

Designed primarily with elementary and secondary schools in mind, the amendment is also called the "Protection of the Rights and Privacy of Students." It is a section from the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

No longer can teachers, some of whom hold prejudices against students, unjustly control and willingly manipulate that child's educational destiny through his or her records.

The Buckley Amendment authorizes parents and students over 18 years of age or in college to challenge the contents of student's records after a written request is made.

According to a recent report, Dorothy Sauer, Supt. of Illinois school Dist. 26, stated: "Whereas a counselor in the past might have written at great length, they now have to be more objective and back everything up with FACTUAL INFORMATION."



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
